

Oasis Elementary School
School Site Council Meeting Minutes
January 7, 2016

7. As part of the ongoing/unfinished business, discussion continued for the 2015/2016 Goal Review and the 2016/2017 Goal Development. It was agreed upon that the goals should be increased in realistic increments with Oasis Elementary meeting or exceeding the states goals for English Language Arts and also, meeting or exceeding Oasis's previous scores in Math, as well as meeting and exceeding the states goals.

It was agreed that the school wide growth goal in English Language Arts should improve to 49% during the 2015/2016 school year. In Math, it was agreed that an appropriate school wide growth goal of 45% was realistic during the 2015/2016 school year. These numbers were seen as a realistic and attainable goal for both students and teachers.

Due to time constraints, Mrs. Childs and Mrs. Mead left the meeting to attend their classes.

A further breakdown of the goals were to the individual grades:

Mrs. Swain said she would figure the percentages for the individual breakdowns for the different ethnic groups, disadvantaged, English learners, etc. Mrs. Swain advocated for continued use of the GLAD (Guided Language and Design) strategy in the classrooms through programs such as Lexia and ST Math. Continued success is possible using this strategy as well as parent and teacher participation to ensure student successes.

Jesse Montes motioned to the council for these numbers to be approved. Marilyn Torres seconded this motion. It was brought forward for a vote and everyone approved of these percentages as attainable goals.

8. There wasn't any new business discussed during this meeting.

3. There were no additions or changes made to the agenda.

4. Previous minutes were read by council secretary. There were two notable changes in those minutes. At the last meeting, (12/03/2015), Melinda Montes was voted Vice Chairperson and not Treasurer. This change was noted and made during this meeting. The next noted change was at the last meeting when discussing Oasis Elementary lost student enrollment, the number of students mentioned (585 down to 530) were projected numbers not absolute numbers. We did lose students for the 2015/2016 school year but the exact number was not mentioned.

With these changes made, the minutes were approved. Donette Swain motioned for the approval of the minutes. Susan Fogg seconded the motion. The motion was approved by all of the members present.

5. As per the previous meeting there was a requested breakdown of the monies used for the Art and Music Grant. Mrs. Swain supplied the documentation of Mrs. Wolters art initiative for the amount of \$402. There is approximately \$2289.75 left to appropriate for the remaining grant monies.

Mrs. Childs supplied information from the ELD (English Language Development) meeting she attended. She made mention due to the weather the meeting was cut short. Handouts were given showing progresses for the ELD students enrolled at Oasis Elementary School. She also went over a brief breakdown of the ELD process in as much as how a student becomes enrolled, reclassified, and released from the program.

6. As there were no others present, there were not any public comments made.
